DIMITRIJE MITRINOVIC AND HIS LEGACY

The idea of the conference is to analyse the impact of Dimitrije (Dimitri) Mitrinovic (1887–1953) and the circles that he initiated (“the Graham Circle”, the New Age circle, the Adler Society, the New Europe Group...) on: 1. European esoteric literature, and 2. on his reform projects aimed at the betterment of humanity (pacifism, cosmopolitanism, European idea, spiritual renaissance etc.).

There would be two sessions: one focused on esotericism and the theoretical works of Mitrinovic, and the other focused on his reform projects. However, the idea is to analyse the interrelations of the two tracks of Mitrinovic’s legacy since they often intertwined and appeared inextricably linked.

A collection of essays in English is to follow from the hybrid/Zoom conference.

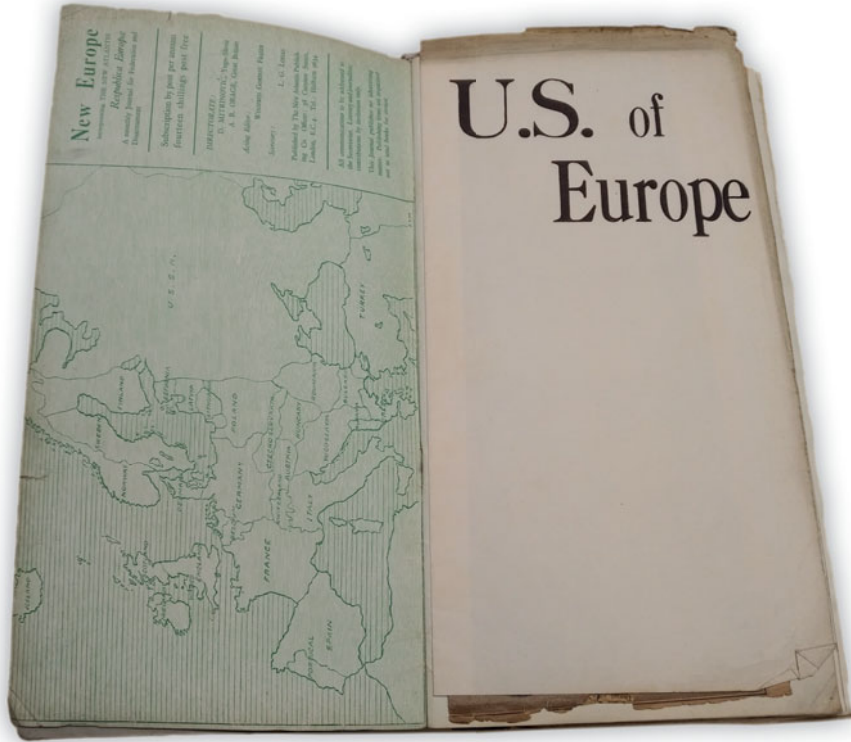
